# Voter Captain Program Helps Hartford Residents Get Out and Vote

Culturally relevant outreach can enhance voter education and empower underrepresented groups to participate in elections. This is especially important in Hartford, which typically has among the lowest voter turnout in our state.

A grant from the Hartford Foundation for Public Giving supported **Trinity College** and the **Hartford Votes Coalition** in their efforts to boost voter participation through the **Voter Captain program**. This initiative leverages residents' shared values and personal stories to encourage family, friends, and neighbors to the poll.

**Election Day is Tuesday, November 5th**. For the first time, Connecticut voters can take advantage of early voting. With a 14-day window, you now have more flexibility to cast your ballot before Election Day.
