2024 ACCOMPLISHMENTS

197 Grants awarded in 2024

Total of \$733,488 awarded in 2024

642 Grants awarded since the beginning of the program.

Total of \$2,434,755 awarded since beginning of program.

700 individual volunteers engaged since the beginning of the program
